## FASTBREAK POINTS: 10 THINGS TO KNOW

- For the first time in 314 days, the Daemen Wildcats hit the hardwood when they host the Mercyhurst Lakers at Lumsden Gymnasium to kick off their abbreviated 2020-21 campaign due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Wildcats are coming off their most successful season since transitioning to NCAA Division II. Daemen posted a 23-5 overall record and captured the program's first East Coast Conference tournament championship.
- When they take the floor Saturday, Daemen will be doing so as a nationally ranked team for the first time in the program's NCAA era (2015-present). The Wildcats are ranked 20th in the latest D2SIDA national poll which was released earlier this week. Daemen also tops the D2SIDA East Region poll for the first time. Mercyhurst is ranked fourth in the Atlantic Region and receiving votes nationally.
- In 2019-20, Daemen posted its first 20-win season since 2012-13 and their 16th in program history. The Wildcats also posted a 13-game winning streak during the season, which ranks as the longest winning streak of their NCAA era (2015-present). Daemen led the ECC in scoring margin (+14.2), ranked second in scoring offense (69.2 ppg) and third in scoring defense (55.0 ppg). 16 of Daemen's 23 wins were by 15 or more points.
- Daemen returns three starters and seven players, including All-ECC selections **Tiara Filbert**, **Caroline White** and **Katie Titus**. All finished among the ECC's top-15 scoring leaders. Filbert ranked third among the league scoring leaders (14.4, also a team-high, Titus ranked sixth (13.1 ppg) and White ranked seventh (12.9 ppg).
- Filbert, recently named the ECC Preseason Player of the Year, enters the weekend 10 points shy of becoming the 25th member of the program's 1,000-Point Club. She has totaled 990 points, 396 rebounds, 229 assists and 103 steals in 85 career games.
- A first-team All-ECC selection last year, White established career-high for points (336), rebounds (181), assists (44) and steals (31) this season. She ranked third on the team in points per game (12.9) and second in rebounds per game (7.0), field goal percentage (.439) and minutes per game (33.7).
- Titus totaled a team-high eight double-doubles of the year and averaged 13.1 points and a team-high 8.3 rebounds per game last year and continues to emerge as one of the top players in the ECC. The junior forward ranked second in the conference in three-pointers made (40). A two-time ECC Defensive Player of the Week selection, Titus also led the team and ranked second among ECC players in blocks (49).
- Last season, Daemen held 23 of its 28 opponents to 65 points or less and was 22-1 in those games. The Wildcats also forced 520 turnovers and collected 256 steals. Daemen ranked third among ECC teams in both points allowed per game (55.0) and turnovers forced per game (18.6) and fourth in steals per game (9.1).
- Daemen was one of the hottest teams in the NCAA Division II East Region at the end of last year, as the Wildcats won 14 of their final 16 games. The Wildcats won 21 of their first 24 games this year and are now 37-7 over their last 44 games dating back to 2018-19.
- The Wildcats were a perfect 9-0 at home last season, extending their home-court winning streak to 18 straight games dating back to the 2018-19 season. Daemen's home winning streak ranks as the longest active streak among all East Region teams, as well as 10th longest among all Division II teams.

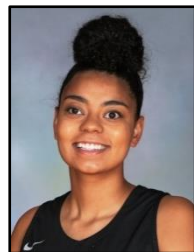

## CHAMPIONSHIP CALIBER: WILDCATS CLAIM ECC TOURNAMENT TITLE WITH 68-56 WIN OVER MOLLOY

### Daemen Earns First ECC Tournament Crown And Automatic Bid To The NCAA Division II Tournament

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The historic season for the Daemen College women's basketball team will continue for at least another week.

The Wildcats claimed their first-ever East Coast Conference tournament title and earned the league's automatic bid to the 64-team National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II Championship following a gutsy 68-56 victory over Molloy College here today in the championship game of the 2020 ECC Tournament. Daemen will be making its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since the Wildcats first became eligible in 2016.

Daemen, which was making its first-ever appearance in the ECC Tournament championship game, improves to 23-5 on the year. The 23 wins are the most of Daemen's NCAA Division II era (2015-present) and the most since the Wildcats went 26-7 in 2012-13. Molloy, which saw its eight-game winning streak come to an end, dropped to 22-9. The Lions are in contention for one of the five at-large bids to the East Regional of the NCAA Tournament. The entire NCAA Tournament field will be unveiled tonight at 10 p.m. on [NCAA.com](http://NCAA.com).

Today's game took place at the UDC Sports Complex on the campus of the University of the District of Columbia and was streamed nationwide on ESPN3 as part of the NCAA Division II Basketball Showcase.

#### IMPACT PLAYERS

- Daemen's five starters accounted for 66 of the team's 68 points.
- Tournament Most Outstanding Player Katie Titus (Penfield, N.Y.) racked up her second double-double of the weekend, as she totaled 24 points, 13 rebounds and four blocks. The sophomore forward connected on 10-of-21 field goals and made 3-of-3 from the charity stripe. A second-team All-ECC pick this year, she totaled 16 points and 14 caroms in yesterday's 76-56 win over New York Tech in the semifinals.
- Redshirt junior Tiara Filbert (Batavia, N.Y.), an all-tournament selection, played all 40 minutes for the second-straight game and totaled 13 points, seven rebounds and six assists. A first-team All-ECC pick this year, she scored a team-high 20 points in the semifinals.
- Junior Caroline White (Fairport, N.Y.) was also named to the all-tournament team. A first-team All-ECC pick this year, she added 12 points, seven rebounds and two steals this afternoon.
- Senior Jordan Heinold (Hamburg, N.Y.), a third-team All-ECC pick this year, saw limited playing time due to foul trouble, but still managed to total 10 points and four boards in 21 minutes of action.
- Graduate student Ashli Jeune (Westhampton, N.J.) played a season-high 39 minutes and contributed seven points, four rebounds and six assists.
- Reserve guard Autumn Buchsensschutz (Port Allegany, Pa.) saw significant playing time for the second-straight day and produced two points, two rebounds and two assists.
- Graduate student Kadijah Dickson and junior Gabriella Aspuru were both named to the all-tournament team for Molloy. Dickson totaled 26 points and five rebounds, while Aspuru added 15 points, five boards and two steals.

#### QUARTER-BY-QUARTER SUMMARY

**First Quarter (Daemen 14, Molloy 9)** - Molloy scored the first seven points of the game, but the Wildcats responded with a 10-0 run of their own and took a 10-7 lead after White made two free throws with just over four minutes left in the quarter. Molloy scored its first points in nearly four minutes on their next possession, but the Lions would go scoreless the rest of the quarter and Daemen regained a five points lead, 14-9, after Filbert canned two free throws with 1:47 left. Neither team scored the rest of way.

**Second Quarter (Daemen 15, Molloy 13)** - Both teams struggled to score early in the second quarter and the Daemen lead was 16-11 four minutes into the frame when the Wildcats strung together seven unanswered points and took a 12-point lead, 23-11, after Filbert fed Titus for a layup with just under five minutes left before halftime. Dickson quickly cut the lead in half, as she converted back-to-back conventional three-point plays, but Filbert fed Titus for another layup and Filbert scored following an offensive rebound to push the Daemen lead back to double digits, 27-17. Molloy came up empty on its next possession, but Daemen could not take advantage and the Lions were able to cut the lead to seven points, 27-20, after sophomore Katie Marquardt hit a three-pointer with 1:18 left in the frame. Filbert fed Titus down low again on Daemen's next trip down the floor, and Molloy closed out the first half scoring when senior Kathryn Gibson canned two free throws with 33 seconds left.

**Third Quarter (Molloy 17, Daemen 20)** - Shots started to fall for both teams at the start of the third quarter, as the teams traded buckets for the first five minutes of the frame and the Daemen lead was still seven points (41-34) midway through the stanza. Titus bumped that up to 12 points, 46-34, when she delivered a layup off a nice feed from Jeune and a three-pointer off a kick out by freshman Marina Maerkl (Binghamton, N.Y.). The Wildcats went scoreless over the final 3:20 of the quarter and Daemen was clinging to a four point lead, 46-42, heading into the final 10 minutes.

**Fourth Quarter (Daemen 22, Molloy 14)** - A jumper by Dickson 40 seconds into the final quarter made it a two point game, but Daemen answered with a three-pointer by White and two free throws by Titus to regain a 51-44 lead. Molloy answered with a jumper by Dickson and later made it a one point game, 51-50, after Aspuru made two free throws with 5:35 to play. Both teams had chances to score over the next 1:21, but the score remained 51-50 until Heinold drained a clutch three-pointer off a feed from Filbert. Dickson was off the mark on Molloy's next possession and Heinold made two free throws with 3:31 left to make it 56-50 Daemen. A key point in the game came with just over two minutes left and Daemen up 56-51. The Wildcats grabbed two offensive rebounds during a flurry of action around the Daemen hoop, and the effort eventually paid off when Jeune hit Titus with a nice no-look pass and Titus converted the layup for a 58-51 Daemen lead. Both teams came up empty on their next possession and after a Molloy turnover Filbert made two free throws to give Daemen a 60-51 lead with 1:06 left. Molloy came no closer than eight points (64-56) down the stretch.

## INSIDE THE BOX SCORE

- After shooting just 28-percent (10-36) overall and making just 1-of-13 three-pointers in the first half, Daemen connected on 11-of-24 (46%) shots overall and 5-of-11 from downtown in the second half. Daemen also finished a perfect 20-for-20 from the free throw line, including a 12-for-12 mark in the fourth quarter.
- Molloy made just 2-of-15 shots in the fourth quarter and finished 16-of-59 (27%) from the field overall. The Lions made just 3-of-12 three-point attempts, but kept the game close by hitting 21-of-23 free throws.
- Daemen dominated the glass for the second-straight game, as the Wildcats posted a 48-34 edge in total rebounds and grabbed 18 offensive rebounds. Molloy finished with a slight edge in points off turnovers (15-14) and second chance points (13-12), while Wildcats held a sizable advantage in points in the paint (28-14).

## GAME NOTES

- Women's basketball becomes the second sport from Daemen to win an ECC Tournament championship. Women's volleyball also earned an ECC Tournament crown in 2018, ironically with a 3-1 win over Molloy in the championship match.
- Daemen, Jefferson University and Stonehill College have claimed the region's three automatic bids to the NCAA Tournament. Jefferson defeated Holy Family, 63-59, in the Central Athletic Collegiate Conference title game today, while Stonehill knocked off Saint Anselm, 80-61, in the Northeast-10 Conference tournament championship today.
- Daemen has reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since the 2012-13 season—and the 16th time in program history.
- Daemen was making its third-straight appearance in the ECC Tournament. The Wildcats entered this weekend without a win in ECC Tournament action. Daemen suffered a 76-64 loss at Roberts Wesleyan in the quarterfinals of the 2018 tournament. The Wildcats earned a bye into the semifinals last year, but were upset by New York Tech, 65-44.
- Daemen has now held 23 of its 28 opponents to 65 points or less and the Wildcats are 22-1 in those games.
- Daemen is now 37-7 over its last 44 games dating back to last season.
- Heinold made one three-pointer today and has now made at least one three-pointer in 20-straight games. She has totaled a career-high 70 three-pointers this year and is just the fifth player in program history to make 70 or more three-pointers in a season—and the first since Raeann Stilwell made a school-record 77 in 2013-14. She has totaled 178 three-pointers in 95 career games and ranks third among the program's all-time leaders.
- Filbert has now scored in double figures in eight of the last nine games. She will enter the NCAA Tournament just 10 points shy of 1,000 for her career and four rebounds shy of 400 career caroms.
- White has totaled career-highs for points (336), rebounds (181), assists (44) and steals (31) this season.
- Titus scored her 700th career point today. She has posted a career-high 367 points and 233 rebounds this season and has totaled 707 points (12.6 pg) and 435 rebounds (7.8 pg) over her two-year career.
- Jeune went 4-for-4 from the free throw line today and ranks second among the ECC leaders in free throws attempted (137) and made (95) this season.
- Daemen totaled 37 assists on just 46 field goals over the two games this weekend.
- Daemen becomes the fourth different ECC Tournament champion over the past four years. Molloy claimed the title in 2017, while St. Thomas Aquinas (2018) and New York Tech (2019) followed.

## ECC CHAMPION WILDCATS HEADED TO FIRST-EVER NCAA TOURNEY

AMHERST, N.Y. - Fresh off the program's first-ever East Coast Conference tournament championship, Daemen College is dancing into the NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Championship which gets underway later this week with regional tournaments across the country. The full 64-team NCAA tournament bracket was announced late this evening in a [selection show broadcast on NCAA.com](https://www.ncaa.com).

The [tournament field](#) is broken down into eight regions, consisting of eight teams each. Daemen is one of 24 conference champions to earn an automatic qualifying bid to the tournament. The Division II Women's Basketball Committee selects the remaining 40 at-large bids.

Daemen is the No. 7 seed in the East Region, and the Wildcats will make their NCAA tournament debut by meeting second-seeded Stonehill College in a first-round game this Friday, March 13 at the Center for Recreation and Sport on the campus of Adelphi University in Garden City, N.Y. Adelphi was awarded the region's No. 1 seed and host privileges for the entire regional tournament. The top-seeded Panthers will meet eighth-seeded Jefferson University, which captured the Central Atlantic Athletic Conference championship earlier today. Additional first-round matchups include No. 4 University of the Sciences taking on fifth-seeded and ECC runner-up Molloy College and an all-Northeast-10 Conference matchup with No. 3 St. Anselm College meeting No. 6 Le Moyne College.

Game times, ticket and broadcast information for the East Region Championship will be announced later this week.

Daemen will enter NCAA tournament play with a 23-5 record. After capturing a share of their first ECC regular-season title with a 13-3 conference mark, the Wildcats went on to win the ECC tournament crown in our nation's capital this weekend. Daemen downed third-seeded New York Tech 76-56 in the semifinals, snapping the Bears' nine-game winning streak. In Sunday's tournament final, they broke the eight-game winning streak of fourth-seeded Molloy College with a 68-56 triumph. The Wildcats have won 15 of their last 17 games, and are in the midst of the program's first 20-win season since gaining full NCAA Division II membership prior to the 2015-16 academic year.

Stonehill will enter the NCAA tournament with a matching 23-5 record. The Skyhawks knocked off St. Anselm earlier today to win their sixth NE-10 tournament crown. The Wildcats and Skyhawks met in the 2019-20 season opener, a game won 77-70 by the latter. It's one of just four losses to East Region opponents for the Wildcats this season. The Daemen-Stonehill winner advances to Saturday's regional semifinals to face either St. Anselm or Le Moyne. A full opening-round preview will be posted to [daemenwildcats.com](https://daemenwildcats.com) later this week.

Winners of the eight regional tournaments will advance to the Elite Eight which is slated for March 24-27 at the Birmingham (Ala.) CrossPlex.







## JENEPPER BANKER

### HEAD COACH • FIFTH SEASON • SPRINGFIELD, '85

Jenepher Banker will embark on her fifth season as the head women's basketball coach at Daemen College in 2020-21 as she continues to build Western New York's premier NCAA Division II program. Banker was introduced as the fourth head coach in the modern era of the program in 2016 and has since led the Wildcats to a 64-47 overall record and a 45-25 mark in East Coast Conference play.

The 2019-20 season marked Daemen's finest since transitioning to the ECC and NCAA Division II. Banker guided the squad to a 23-5 overall record - the program's first 20-win season since 2012-13 - as well as a share of the ECC regular season championship and the ECC tournament title. They did so by combining stingy defense with solid offensive production, especially from behind the three-point arc. The Wildcats allowed just 55.0 points per game, ranking 13th in the country, and went 9-1 when holding opponents to less than 50 points. On the offensive end, Daemen set program records for three-pointers made in a game (20 vs. Queens on January 10) and season (238) and ranked first in the ECC for three-pointers made per game (8.5). Daemen's +14.1 scoring margin also topped the ECC and ranked 30th nationally.

The team's success in 2019-20 included a 13-game winning streak spanning some 69 days - the longest winning streak of the program's NCAA Division II era. The Wildcats also posted a 9-0 record at home, going undefeated for the third time in program history and for the first time since 2007-08. The Wildcats rose as high as No. 5 in the Division II Sports Information Directors of America (D2SIDA) East Region media poll as well as the official NCAA regional rankings released late in the season by the Regional Advisory Committee.

After going 13-3 during the conference regular season, the Wildcats experienced postseason success with two wins at the ECC tournament which was played at the UDC Sports Complex in Washington, D.C. Second-seeded Daemen knocked off third-seeded New York Tech in the semifinals, 76-56, on March 7. A day later, Banker led the Wildcats to a 68-56 win over fourth-seeded Molloy in the finals, riding the double-double performance (24 points, 13 rebounds) of sophomore forward Katie Titus who was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

The conference tournament title came with an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. Daemen was awarded the No. 7 seed in the East Region, and was set to make its NCAA tournament debut on March 13 against second-seeded Stonehill. However, the tournament was canceled on March 12 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The groundwork for a championship season was laid in the years prior. Inheriting a team that won nine games in the season prior to her arrival, Banker has presided over Daemen's steady rise in the win column. She led the team to 11 wins in her debut season and 12 more during the 2017-18 campaign which included the program's first ECC tournament berth.

In 2018-19, Banker led the Wildcats to an 18-10 overall record and a 15-3 mark in conference games. The 15 conference wins established a new benchmark for Daemen's ECC era as the Wildcats placed second in the ECC standings. The Wildcats also achieved their first-ever regional ranking at the Division II level that season, debuting in the D2SIDA East Region media poll in a tie for No. 10 on February 4. They later debuted at No. 10 in the official NCAA regional poll released on February 20. Daemen's ascent into the regional conversation came in the midst of winning 14 of their final 15 regular season contests, including a streak of 11 in a row. Banker picked up her 100th win as a collegiate head coach along the way, a 79-47 defeat of conference foe District of Columbia on January 27.

Over her first four seasons at the helm, Banker has played an integral role in the development of seven all-conference players. Those players account for 10 total all-conference selections, including first-team picks Sarah Saba (2017, 2018), Katie Titus (2019), Tiara Filbert (2020) and Caroline White (2020). The team's four all-conference selections in 2020 are the most of the program's Division II era. Additionally, Titus was named the ECC Rookie of the Year in 2019 to become the first Daemen player to receive a major award from the conference.

Banker holds more than 30 years of coaching experience at various levels, ranging from Division I to high school. Her first collegiate experience came as an assistant coach at Iowa State University, then of the Big Eight Conference, from 1986-88, and later as an assistant at Canisius College from 1993-95.

Between assistant coaching stops, Banker served as the head coach at Penn State-Behrend in Erie, Pa. While there, she led the Lions' NCAA Division III program to a 67-61 overall record, including a 41-12 mark in her final two seasons. Her 1991-92 team went 23-4, winning the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) South Region championship. That season, her team garnered Penn State-Behrend's first-ever national ranking in any sport. She still ranks second all-time in coaching victories, and was inducted into Penn State-Behrend's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1994.

Later, Banker settled at the high school level, coaching the varsity team at Grand Island High School from 1998-2013, building the Lady Vikings into a regional contender with seven Section VI championships, four appearances in the Far West Regional, and one appearance at the New York State final four. During her tenure, Banker's teams were recognized with the New York State Scholar-Athlete Team Award for 15 straight seasons, and she developed 10 players that went on to play college basketball, as well as four of the five 1,000-point scorers in school history.

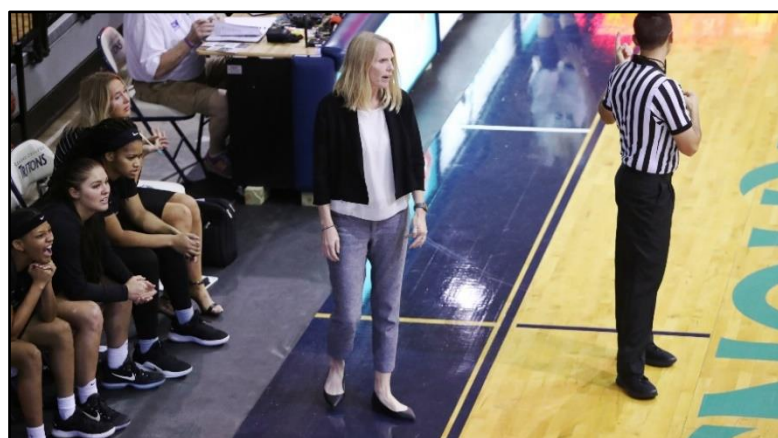

**DAEMEN QUICK FACTS**

Daemen returns three starters and eight players from last year's team that finished 23-5 overall and shared the ECC regular season title (13-3) before defeating third-seeded New York Tech and fourth-seeded Molloy to capture the program's first-ever ECC Tournament crown. Daemen enters the 2020-2021 season as the favorite in the ECC. The defending champion Wildcats were picked first in the ECC preseason poll for the first time since joining the league in 2013.

**HELLO, MY NAME IS...**

Daemen earned its first-ever berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament this past season. By comparison, the other seven teams that qualified from the East Region had made a combined 67 appearances. Due to COVID-19 protocols, the tournament was cancelled.

**POLL POSITION**

Daemen was ranked first in the D2SIDA East Region Media Poll and 20th in the D2SIDA National Media Poll – both for the first time in program history. This comes after being ranked ninth in the final NCAA Division II East Region rankings and fifth in the final D2SIDA East Region Media Poll for the 2019-20 season. The Wildcats have now been ranked in 17 successive D2SIDA regional polls, a span that dates back to January 2018.

**HISTORIC START**

The Wildcats won 21 of their first 24 games this past season, which ranks as the best start of their NCAA Division II era (2015-present) and their best start overall since opening the 2003-04 season by winning 26 of their first 29 games. The Wildcats won 13-straight games last year, which is a new program record for most consecutive wins during the program's NCAA Division II era (2015-present). It was the longest winning streak overall since the 2007-08 season when the Wildcats posted a 17-game winning streak.

**THE NEXT STEP**

Daemen made its third straight appearance in the ECC Championship in 2020, but did not have an ECC Tournament win until posting wins over New York Tech (76-56) and Molloy (68-56) to claim its first-ever ECC Tournament title.

**20/20**

Last year, Daemen reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since the 2012-13 season—and the 16th time in program history.

**PICKING UP WHERE THEY LEFT OFF**

Daemen was one of the hottest teams in the NCAA Division II East Region at the end of last year, as the Wildcats won 14 of their final 16 games. The Wildcats won 21 of their first 24 games this year and are now 37-7 over their last 44 games dating back to 2018-19.

### GETTING DEFENSIVE

In the 2019-20 season, Daemen held 23 of its 28 opponents to 65 points or less and was 22-1 in those games. The Wildcats also forced 520 turnovers and collected 256 steals. Daemen ranked third among ECC teams in both points allowed per game (55.0) and turnovers forced per game (18.6) and fourth in steals per game (9.1).

### LONG RANGE THREATS

Last season, Daemen established a new program record for three-pointers made (238) and attempted (752) in a season—besting the previous standard of 236-693 set in 2009-10. Daemen ranked first among ECC teams in three-pointers made per game (8.5) and three-pointers attempted per game (26.9). The Wildcats also ranked third in three-point field goal percentage (.316). All five of Daemen's starters made at least 29 three-pointers on the year. The Wildcats made a program-record 20 three-pointers in an 89-62 win over Queens on Jan. 10—which ranks sixth for most triples in a game among all NCAA Division II teams this season.

### SEASON OPENERS

Daemen will be looking for their first win in a season opener since defeating American International (70-61) to open the 2017-18 season. The Wildcats have dropped two straight season openers since then.

### PROTECT THIS HOUSE

The Wildcats were a perfect 9-0 at home last season, extending their home-court winning streak to 18 straight games dating back to the 2018-19 season. Daemen's home winning streak ranks as the longest active streak among all East Region teams, as well as 10th longest among all Division II teams.

### BACK IN THE FOLD

No strangers to consistent play, redshirt senior Tiara Filbert and junior Katie Titus top the list of returning players after once again earning all-conference honors in 2019-20. As a redshirt junior, Filbert earned first-team All-ECC recognition after averaging team-highs in points (14.4) and assists (3.7). Titus continued to dominate in the ECC in her sophomore campaign. The second-team All-ECC selection averaged 13.1 points and a team-high 8.3 rebounds per game along with a team-high eight double-doubles. Senior Caroline White ranked third for Daemen in points (12.9) and second in rebounds (7.0) and served as a two-way player en route to the first All-ECC selection of her career. Fellow senior Autumn Buchsenschutz also returns as a key player this season. Junior Mickayla Ivy and sophomore Marina Maerkl also return after being regular rotation players last season.

### FRESH FACES

The 2020-21 roster features several newcomers, including Division I transfer Mary Foster (New Hampshire) and freshmen Natalie Angeletti, Alahna Paige and Kaytlyn Matz. Foster spent two seasons at UNH where she appeared in 20 games. As a freshman, the Elmira native averaged 1.4 rebounds in 7.2 minutes. Angeletti won four Section VI Class D championships in five seasons at Panama. In 2020, the Panthers went 20-2 and finished No. 2 in the state poll. Three NYS Class D Final Fours and consecutive state title games (2016-2017) later, the 2020 NYS Class D Player of the Year is their all-time scorer (1,751 points) while also topping 1,000 rebounds. A four-year letterwinner at Irondequoit, Paige scored 28.6 points per game as a senior, was the All-Greater Rochester Co-Player of the Year and Class A All-State first team after leading the Eagles to a 2020 Section VI Class A championship appearance. She is their all-time scorer at Irondequoit with over 1,000 points. A four-year varsity player at Carmel Catholic, Matz won three regional championships and made Sweet 16 and Elite 8 appearances in the Illinois state playoffs. Team MVP as a senior, Matz was honorable mention all-conference and made the Lake County All-Area team.

### LETHAL LEFTY

Redshirt senior Tiara Filbert was named the ECC Player of the Week twice last season – the latest on Feb. 17 after leading Daemen to league wins over St. Thomas Aquinas and Mercy. A first-team All-ECC selection, Filbert averaged a team-high 14.4 points in her redshirt junior campaign. Recently named the ECC Preseason Player of the Year, Filbert also led the team in assists per game (3.7) and ranked third in rebounds per game (5.1). Among the ECC leaders she ranked third in points per game, third in minutes per game (35.3), fifth in free throw percentage (.792), fifth in assists per game (3.7) and 11th in field goal percentage (.428).

### THE WHITE STUFF

**Caroline White** earned ECC Player of the Week honors twice last season during her junior campaign – the latest on Feb. 10 after leading the Wildcats to wins over Bridgeport and Queens. A first-team All-ECC selection last year, the now senior forward established career-high for points (336), rebounds (181), assists (44) and steals (31) this season. She ranked third on the team in points per game (12.9) and second in rebounds per game (7.0), field goal percentage (.439) and minutes per game (33.7). Among the ECC leaders she rank seventh in points per game, first in offensive rebounds per game (3.5), 10th in field goal percentage and eighth in total rebounds per game.

### TITUS THE TALENTED

Junior forward **Katie Titus** posted back-to-back double-doubles during the ECC Tournament, was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player after averaging 20.0 points and 13.5 rebounds over the two games and now looks for more success in 2020-21. A second-team All-ECC as a sophomore, Titus totaled a team-high eight double-doubles of the year and averaged 13.1 points and a team-high 8.3 rebounds per game. She also ranked second in three-pointers made (40). A two-time ECC Defensive Player of the Week selection, the current junior led the team and ranked second among ECC players in blocks (49). In 2018-19, Titus was voted first team All-ECC and ECC Rookie of the Year last year after leading the team in points per game (12.1), rebounds per game (7.2), three-pointers (32) and blocks (38). She became the first women's basketball player from Daemen to garner a major award from the ECC since the Wildcats joined the conference. She also became the first freshman to earn first-team All-ECC honors since Madison Rowland of Queens College in 2013-14.
